Majestic Makeover

AFTER ROOMSCAPES INC. successfully remodeled their kitchen to culinary perfection, this Mission Viejo, California, couple decided their bathroom was also deserving of a major face-lift in preparation for visits from their grown children and future grandchildren. With Roomscapes designer Deborah Nassetta, CKD, CBD, CID, at the helm, the transformation began.

The bathroom had to be gutted for a full remodel, as the original design provided several challenges and inspired many changes. It had unattractive floating soffits with florescent lights, and the vaulted ceiling was too high and had a large exposed beam. Rebuilding the ceiling to a lower height, Nassetta added a center coffer with indirect LED lighting and a chandelier, which added a formal grace and elegance to the bath design.

The original bathtub was too small and had a lot of empty deck space, so Nassetta selected a larger, much deeper tub and extended the platform into the shower to create a bench. The new shower was enlarged and includes a rain shower and traditional showerhead, as well as a hand shower for a spa effect. The frameless glass enclosure evokes a feeling of openness and exposes the beautiful stone shower walls and brushed nickel fittings. Bespoke with beauty, this rehabbed bath is guaranteed to provide repose through the generations. «
